Human beings are complex and diverse. The way we behave – whether this is the things we say, the things we do, our body language, our gestures and our movements - can all be influenced by many different factors.

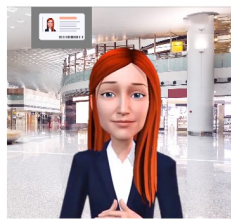
When someone's behaviour is caused by a mental or a physical illness, their situation is made worse when other people respond negatively to behaviour that they may not be able to control.

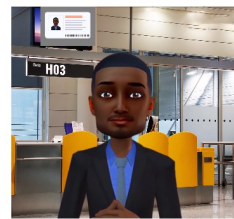
Completing this programme will support you to :

ICoCA

Private security personnel working in conflict and post-conflict states are tasked with securing property and people in highly complex environments and challenging situations. So what training do officers get to ensure professional conduct that respects human rights and international humanitarian law?

ICoCA convened an expert panel to consider the challenges and opportunities in ensuring private security personnel operating in complex environments around the world are trained for the job. Among other questions panellists considered:

What are the most effective ways to train private security personnel, what are the costs in doing so and how is training best assessed?

How should sometimes complex concepts such as human rights and international humanitarian law be relayed?

Where does responsibility ultimately lie to ensure that private security workforce have the competencies required to conduct themselves professionally in complex environments?

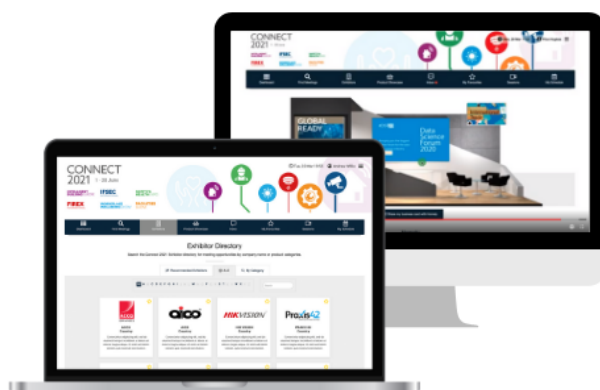

Security Officers

The IFPO has commissioned Perpetuity Research to undertake a study of the work and training of security officers (sometimes referred to as security guards). That is those involved in frontline uniformed security work (typically meaning duties protecting people/buildings/sites)
